


Prepare Student Login Information to Send Home

2 Simple Sign-On Login

3 Clever/ClassLink Login

If Progress Learning is rostered through Clever or ClassLink, students will not need a separate password for Progress Learning. They will log in through your campus portal and click on the Progress Learning logo on their dashboard to log in to their account.

Students can also log in to their Clever/ClassLink portal from the Progress Learning login page. This will then redirect them to log in through the Clever/ClassLink portal.

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Student Activity Suggestions for Practice at Home

Option 1: Follow a Weekly Schedule for At-Home Practice

Here's a suggested weekly schedule of what students can do to review and practice in Progress Learning.

Mon	Work for 30 minutes in your Study Plan. K-5th grade students try to earn 3 Galaxy Stars to show mastery on a standard. 6th-12th grade students work toward turning at least 1 yellow dot or 1 pink dot into a green dot to show mastery on a standard.
Tues	Complete practice with videos in your Study Plan for two standards with the 10 question practice set questions. Write 3 reflections on what you learned for each video.
Wed	Take a practice test in your Study Plan and review any questions answered incorrectly. The results can be found in your Graded Work.
Thurs	K-8th grade students complete fluency practice in Skills Practice for 20 minutes. 6-12th grade students work to earn at least 5 tokens and celebrate practice in the Game Arcade.
