Summer Site Refresh / UI Overhaul

What is it?

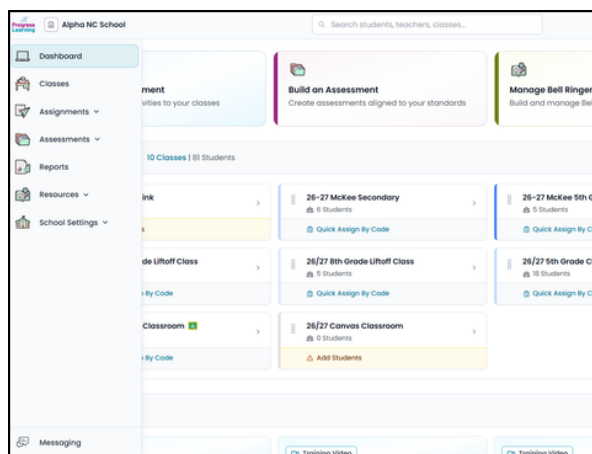
We've refreshed the platform's look and feel with a modernized user interface to improve navigation, usability, and the overall user experience. While the core functionality remains familiar, users will notice updated designs throughout the platform.

This refresh also includes enhancements to the K1 student experience, with K1 scheduled to be deployed later in July, including:

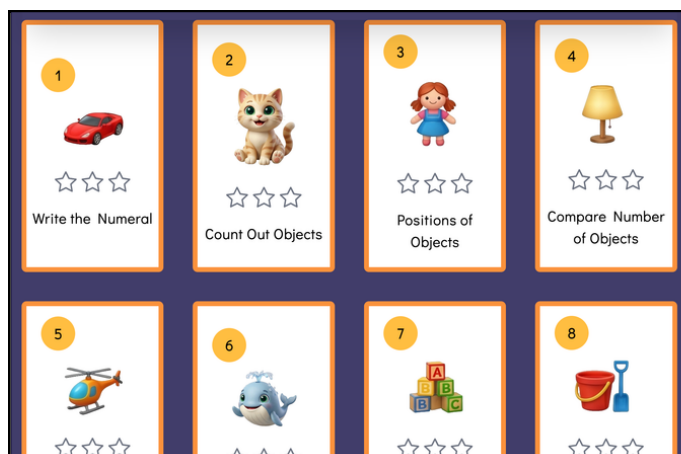
- A simpler, more engaging homepage

Where is it located?

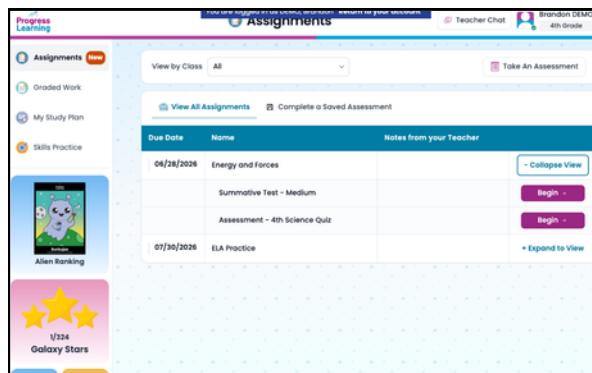
These updates will be visible throughout the platform, including the K1 student experience, teacher dashboards, and student-facing activities.



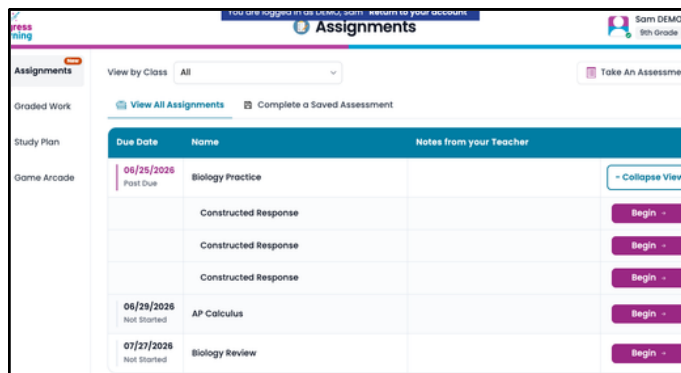
Teacher Dashboard

Family Connect

What is it?

Family Connect is a new parent and guardian portal that provides visibility into student learning within Progress Learning. Guardians can securely access information for one or more students using a single account.



Within Family Connect, guardians can:

- View upcoming, current, and past-due assignments
- View scores for completed assignments and activities
- Monitor their student's learning activity
- Access instructional materials organized by unit and sequence*
- View the same instructional content that their student is using in class*

Where is it located?

District and school administrators can manage Family Connect through **School Settings** → **User Management**, where they can create guardian accounts, import guardians, send welcome emails, and manage guardian access.

Guardians access Family Connect by logging in to the Progress Learning platform using the credentials provided in their welcome email.

Assessment & Assignment Tools

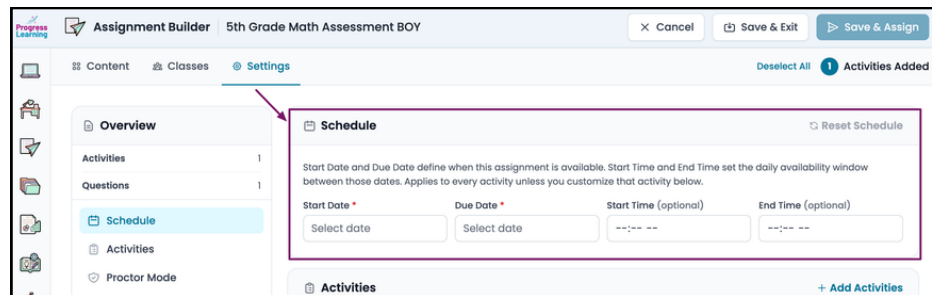
Expanded Assignment Scheduling

What is it?

Assignment scheduling is being expanded to support all activity types. Teachers can now define assignment access windows by setting optional start and end times. Within Group Assignments, individual activities can also have customized scheduling windows. This enhancement provides greater flexibility and control over when students can access assigned content.

Where is it located?

Scheduling options are available within **Assignment Builder** settings when creating or editing assignments.



Proctor Mode Feature

What is it?

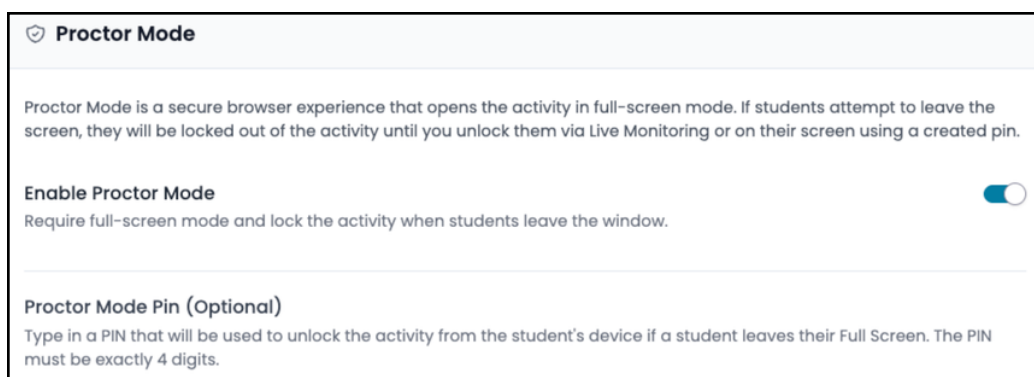
Proctor Mode is a new assignment setting designed to support more secure testing environments. When enabled, students will be notified that they are entering a secure assessment. If a student leaves the secure testing environment, their activity will be locked and require teacher intervention to continue.

Proctor Mode also includes an enhanced monitoring dashboard that allows educators to:

- View student progress through an activity in real time
- Monitor active testing sessions
- Identify students who may need assistance
- Unlock student activities when necessary
- Gain greater visibility into activity participation

Where is it located?

Proctor Mode can be enabled within the **Assignment Builder** settings. The enhanced monitoring dashboard will be available to teachers and administrators via their **Assignment or Assignment Bank if granted Live Monitoring Access**.



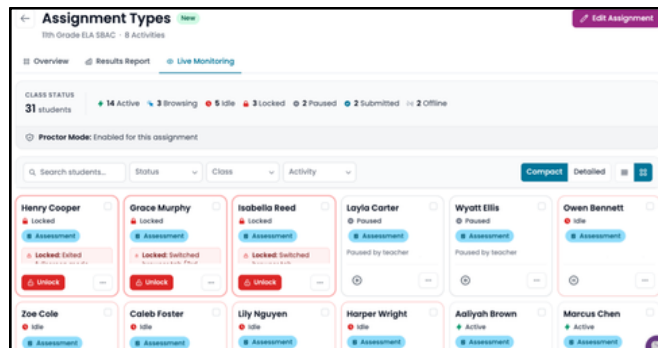
Expanded and Enhanced Live Monitoring

What is it?

Live Monitoring gives teachers and administrators real-time visibility into student assessment activity. Educators can see which students are actively working, monitor progress during assignments and assessments, identify students who may be off task, and take immediate action when needed.

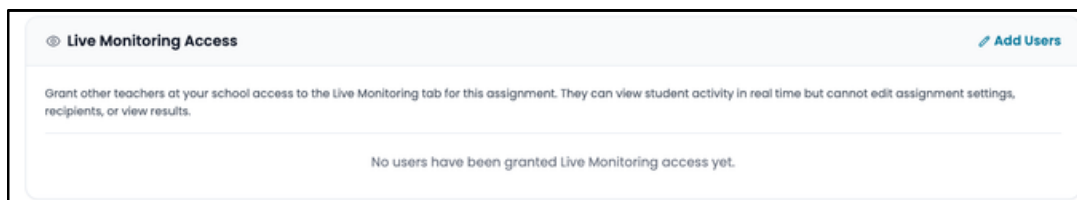
Additional controls allow educators to:

- Pause or resume student activity
- Save and exit a student's session
- Discard and exit a student's session
- Submit an assessment on a student's behalf
- View active and inactive student statuses in real time



NEW: Shared Live Monitoring Access

Grant Live Monitoring access to additional educators, even those not associated with the assignment. This allows grade-level teams, testing coordinators, administrators, and other staff members to monitor the same assessment simultaneously, making campus-wide testing and common assessments easier to manage.



Where is it located?

This can be accessed from the **Assignment Bank** by clicking **Live Monitoring**, or from the **Assignment Dashboard** by clicking into the **Assignment** itself.

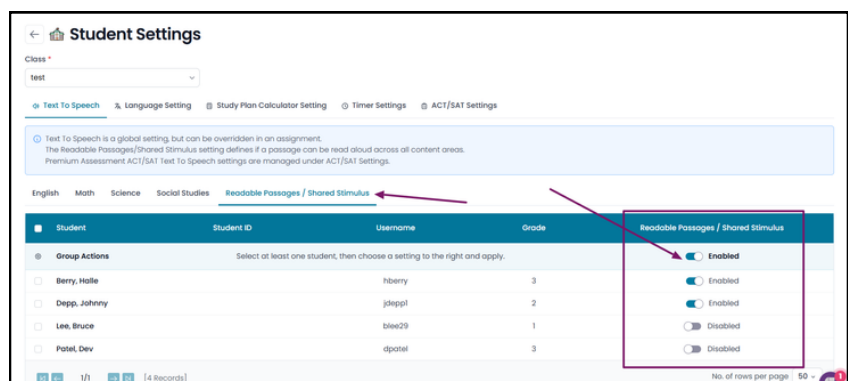
Expanded Text-to-Speech (TTS) Settings

What is it?

We've added a new "Readable Passage/Shared Stimulus TTS" accommodation setting that gives educators greater control over Text-to-Speech functionality. This allows teachers to enable or disable TTS specifically for readable passages/shared stimuli while still maintaining access to TTS accommodations for question content when appropriate.

Where is it located?

This setting is available in **Student Settings** and within **Assignment Builder** settings.



Reporting & Data

Subgroup Data Reporting

What is it?

We're expanding reporting capabilities to include subgroup data analysis. Demographic and program information automatically rostered through SIS integrations and synced through Clever or ClassLink can now be used to analyze performance across student groups, helping schools identify trends and make more informed instructional decisions.

Where is it located?

Subgroup filtering and reporting will initially be available within Progress Reports and Results Reports.

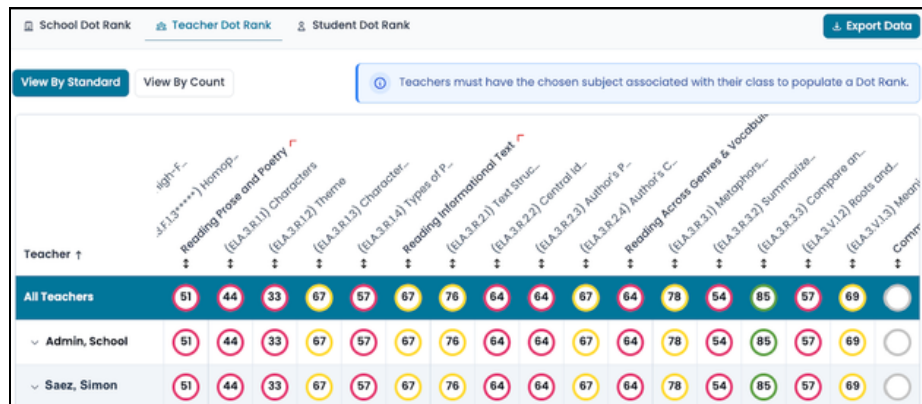
Teacher Dot Rank Tab

What is it?

The new Teacher Dot Rank tab provides a teacher-by-teacher overview of class performance. Users can expand each teacher to view results for individual classes, making it easier to analyze performance across classrooms.

Where is it located?

District and School Administrators can access this feature in **Results Reports** → **View by Assessment** → **Teacher Dot Rank**. School Administrators will also see the Teacher Dot Rank tab in View by Assignment.



Quick Click Remediation for Assessment Results

What is it?

Quick Click Remediation can now be assigned based on a student's average performance for all attempts for the selected assessment. The feature identifies up to three of the student's weakest standards and allows educators to assign targeted practice questions with a single click.

Where is it located?

Navigate to **Results Reports** → **View by Assessment** → **Student Dot Rank** and select **Quick Click Remediation** for an individual student.
