



Support Tennessee House Bill 7004 with Progress Learning

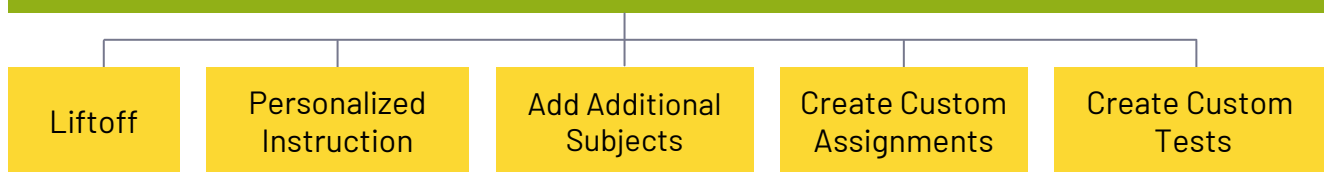
About House Bill 7004

HB 7004 requires local education agencies and public charter schools to establish and administer after-school learning mini-camps, learning loss bridge camps, and summer learning camps to remediate student learning loss. This bill is intended to support students who scored below proficient in math or English language arts on the student's most recent TCAP test or statewide benchmark assessment. At a high level, the legislation establishes:

- Learning mini-camps, an after-school educational program that integrates science, technology, engineering, the arts, and mathematics
- Learning loss bridge camps, a four-week educational program conducted before the beginning of the school year
- Summer learning camps, a six-week summer educational program to address learning loss

Aligned with Progress Learning and Liftoff, HB 7004 is designed to identify students who are behind grade level in specific subjects and give them the focused instruction and support to meet or surpass grade-level standards in a relatively short period of time.

Liftoff Adaptive Intervention

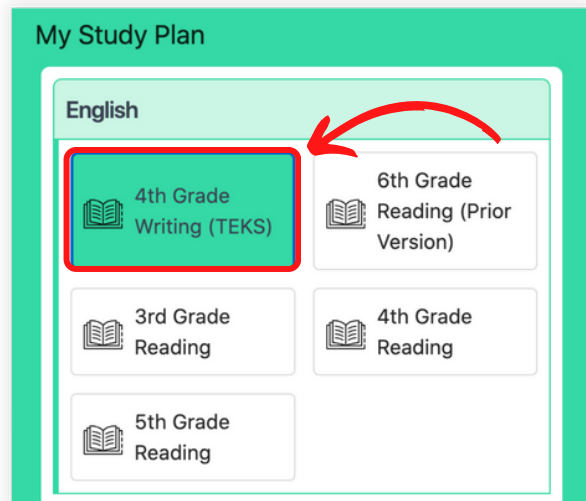
Students take diagnostic tests within the program and are provided with an individualized learning plan called My Galaxies. My Galaxies supports students in math and reading to begin working on foundational standards and skills that students have not mastered in vertical alignment. Liftoff helps recover all learning gaps for elementary and middle school students (grades 2-8).





Personalized Instruction

Progress Learning reinforces Tennessee Academic Standards with a variety of personalized assignments and assessments. Students can take a diagnostic assessment to target which specific standards they need to focus on in an individualized learning plan. Students are then able to review their missed questions to clarify their learning.



Add Additional Subjects

Teachers can add additional subjects to the class where the student is enrolled. This will apply the additional grade-level subject to all students in the class. If the teacher does not want to add an additional grade-level subject to all students in a class, then a separate class can be set up for a small group of students where the subject areas need to be added.

Students can work towards mastering their previous grade-level standards. Students can take a diagnostic test to identify which specific standards they still need to master from last year.

Create Custom Tests & Assignments

Teachers can create custom tests and assignments in the assignment center and differentiate practice to individual students that need reinforcement on specific Tennessee Academic Standards. Teachers can then download reports to track mastery of the standards to further differentiate instruction.
