

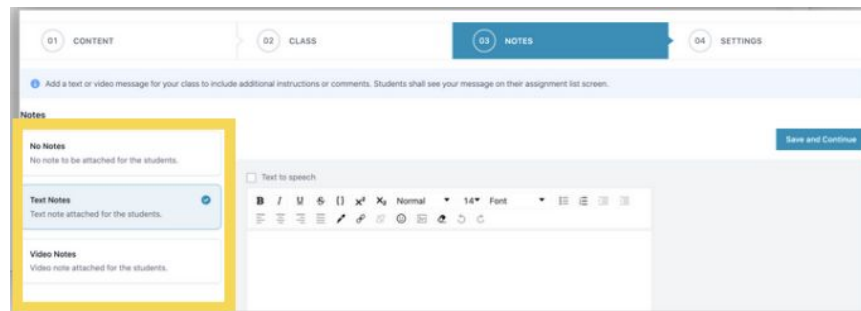
USATestprep did not have a feature that let teachers record and send video messages to students. Teachers could only send text-only messages through the platform.



To assign a video in USATestprep, teachers had to click on the “Assignments” tab and click “Create New Assignment”. Assigning a video was one of the options that teachers could choose.



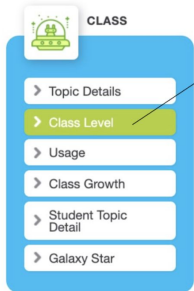
